Mayor Conard presented a proclamation to Robert Barnett for his service to the Riverside Community through the Riverside Fire Department.

Deputy Mayor Hatcher presented a proclamation to Michael Lynch for his service to the Riverside Community through the Delran Emergency Squad.

**Mr. Prisco made a motion that the proclamation honoring Mr. Michael Lynch for his service to the Delran Emergency Squad and the proclamation honoring Mr. Robert Barnett for his service with the Riverside Fire Company be approved seconded by Mr. Van Meter carried.**

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:**

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for March 2009: Investigations – 86, Adult Arrests Total – 45, Motor Vehicle Summons – 136, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 15, Juvenile Charges – 5, Protective Custody – 0, Curfew Violations – 0, False Alarm Calls – 17, False Alarm Warning Letters - 0, Summons for Violation of False Alarms – 0, Domestic Violence Cases –

4 and Stationhouse Adjustments – 4. Chief Tursi also reported the School Resource Officer's progress and investigations, Detective services; various training that the Officers attended; meetings that were attended by the Officers, correspondence received, and grants that are currently being pursued as well as grant programs that have been received. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the report read by Chief Tursi. No questions were presented.

**Motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Prisco that the Chief of Police's report be accepted carried.**

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Report for March 2009: Medical Emergencies – 70, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 2, Fire Stand Bys – 1, Non Emergency Transports – 1, Patients transported to the hospital – 51 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 21.

Mayor Conard stated that the Delran Emergency Squad is doing an excellent job and thanked them.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:**

Mr. Van Meter stated that he will give Mr. March's report since Mr. March has been excused. Mr. Van Meter reported that the Public Works Department performed road maintenance throughout the Township. Public Works began chipping branches every Monday and Friday and collected bagged leaves every Wednesday. Friday Morning sweeps have begun. Four shade trees were cut down, and the trees were trimmed at all the Township owned parks and lots. The fence at the AA Field was removed, and Whomsley Field was prepared for the Easter egg hunt. Mr. Van Meter reported the activities for May 2009. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

**Mr. Prisco made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher to accept the report written by Mr. March and read by Mr. Van Meter carried.**

#### **DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:**

Mr. Prisco thanked Administrator Jack and Chief Financial Officer Crowe for all their work in preparing for the budget. Mr. Prisco also reported that he attended a transportation round table with Administrator Jack. Mr. Prisco stated that there is not much money available for transportation projects. Administrator Jack stated that most of the money will be going to Northern New Jersey Municipalities and stated that she questioned the State Commissioner if a policy will be developed on issuing money to single projects or multiple projects. Mayor Conard stated that the Township has been successful with single grant applications. Administrator Jack stated that the Township will continue to concentrate on the East End Area with the next goal is to add Washington Street from Harrison Street to Bridgeboro Street. Mr. Prisco stated that many representatives from municipalities along the Route 130

corridor complained of the deplorable conditions of Route 130. When questioned, the Commissioner stated that repairing Route 130 was not in the State Capital Budget for this year. Also, there were comments made from local representatives concerning the quiet zones along the Light Rail Line and the double locking gates. The State stated that the gates are very expensive at \$250,000.00 per blocking gates. Mr. Prisco did state that the Assistant Director to the Transit Authority did mention that smarter technology may allow the River Line to operate along with freight trains. Mr. Prisco stated that meeting was very informative.

**Motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Polino to accept the date reported by Mr. Prisco carried.**

**DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:**

Mr. Polino reported that he was at Ft. Dix for the Opening Day Ceremony for the PAL organization and asked Mr. Conard to speak concerning the event. Mr. Conard reported that the opening day was very successful. There were many people in attendance. Also, there were many activities for the people to participate in. Mr. Van Meter stated that Emerson Lucas, Anthony Zirpoli and Bobby Donohue were inducted in the Hall of Fame.

**Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mrs. Hatcher to accept the report submitted from Mr. Polino carried.**

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:**

Mrs. Hatcher reported that the Easter egg hunt was held at Whomsley Field and thanked Administrator Jack, Municipal Clerk Dydek, Mayor Conard, and Committeeman Polino for their assistance. The senior citizen dance will be held on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Teicher is scheduled to appear at the Planning Board in May. Mr. Prisco questioned the time of the senior citizen dance. Administrator Jack answered the event will be held from 4:00pm – 7:00pm.

**Motion made by Mr. Polino and Mr. Prisco to accept the report submitted from Mrs. Hatcher carried.**

**SOLICITOR'S REPORT:**

Solicitor Saponaro reported that he received several more tax appeal notices which he is currently working on. Also, Solicitor Saponaro is currently reviewing the Towing Ordinance and he recommends that the fee schedule be amended. Solicitor Saponaro also informed the Public that a hearing was previously held earlier in the evening which subsequently suspended the liquor license for the Sylbert Corporation.

**Mrs. Hatcher made a motion to accept Solicitor Saponaro's report seconded by Mr. Polino carried.**

### **CLERK – COLLECTOR’S REPORT:**

Mrs. Dydek reported the collection for April 2009 as follows: current year – 54.44%, next year – 0%, the prior year – 99.88%. The second quarter is due May 1, 2009. The Tax Sale was held on April 2, 2009 and \$95,474.62 was collected.

Mrs. Dydek also reported that there have been 514 dog licenses issued and 41 cat licenses issued. Tomorrow, the school board election will be held and the Municipal Clerk’s Office will be open until 9:00pm to handle any election problems that may arise. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.

**Mr. Prisco and Mr. Van Meter made a motion to accept the report read by Mrs. Dydek carried.**

### **ENGINEER’S REPORT:**

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer’s Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.

**Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Polino accepting the Engineer’s Report as written carried.**

### **PLANNING REPORT:**

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Planning Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.

**Motion made by Mr. Polino and Mrs. Hatcher accepting the Planning Report as written carried.**

### **ADMINISTRATOR’S REPORT:**

Administrator Jack stated that her report has been submitted. Administrator Jack reported that street sweeping commenced April 3, 2009 with the Friday morning sweeps and April 6, 2009 with the residential sweeps that are Monday through Thursday. The Stormwater pamphlets have been mailed to the property owners the week of March 16, 2009 and the annual report is due by May 1, 2009. The roadway reconstruction projects are set to begin on April 20, 2009 which is phase II Filmore, Taylor and Kossuth Streets. The Town Hall Renovations Project is scheduled to begin on May 20, 2009. Currently, there is a problem with relocating the Court. Mayor Conard questioned if there would be any concerns if he helped with the search. No concerns were presented. The meetings of the Township offices that are scheduled to be held the second and third Mondays of the months will be relocated to

the Riverside Elementary School cafeteria. A brief discussion ensued concerning the relocation of the meetings. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mr. Polino requested that the Administrator review the situation with the Fire Inspector. Administrator Jack stated that it has been discussed that the life hazard inspections be made by the Township instead of the State. Currently these inspections are annual and apply to certain businesses. The State's ability to perform these inspections is shrinking and the Township requested information from the State on taking over the inspections. The Fire Department does not wish to handle the inspections. Committeepersons Van Meter and Hatcher have met with an inspector from the State and the feedback from the State Inspector and the Fire Department is that the meeting was a success. An anticipated startup date for this project is 2010. However, the Administrator would like to meet with the Fire Company again. The Administrator explained the process of implementing these inspections. Mrs. Hatcher questioned if the Fire Company will provide written documentation that they are not interested in providing the inspections. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative.

**Mr. Prisco and Mr. Polino made a motion to accept the Administrator's report as read carried.**

**CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S REPORT:**

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Code Enforcement Officer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

**Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Van Meter to accept the Code Enforcement Officer's Report as read per Committee member carried.**



**PUBLIC PORTION:**

1) **Mr. Robert Grab, 218 Harrison Street** questioned the following: why the trash company doesn't return the trash cans to the curb when the citizens must place the trash cans on the curb for pick up and when will the lot on Harrison and Clay Streets will be cleaned up.
