3. Filed written notice with the Clerk of the Township of Riverside on January 4, 2008.

The regular meeting of the Riverside Township Committee was held on the above date at the Riverside Township Municipal Building with the following members present: Messrs. Prisco, Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher, and Mr. Conard together with Township Administrator Meghan Jack, Municipal Clerk Susan M. Dydek, Police Chief Paul Tursi and Solicitor Saponaro. Mr. Polino was excused.

Mr. Al Bucchi and Mr. Tom Farrell from the Delran VFW Post 3020 presented Chief Tursi with donation to the Bike Patrol.

Mayor Conard presented a proclamation to Anthony D'Agostino for his service to the residents of Riverside. The proclamation was accepted by his son Mr. Joseph D'Agostino.

Mayor Conard presented a proclamation to Richard Wasco for his service to various organizations in Riverside Township.

Mr. Carroll made a motion to approve the above proclamations, seconded by Mr. Prisco carried.

Mrs. Hatcher presented Mayor Conard with the first safety belt issued from the Riverside School District, for assisting the children of Riverside during an occasion when a crossing guard was not present and the Police were on an emergent call.

Mr. Prisco made a motion to approve the Special Work Session minutes for March 17, 2008 seconded by Mr. Carroll. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs. Prisco, Carroll and Conard. Nays – None. Abstain – Mrs. Hatcher.

Mr. Carroll questioned the amount of bikes for sale and where do the bikes come from. Mayor Conard stated that there are approximately 30 bikes and Mr. March stated that the bikes are unclaimed from either being lost or confiscated.**

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Mayor Conard stated that he has received numerous complaints regarding speeding on Greenwood Avenue. Chief Tursi thanked the Delran VFW Post 3020 for their generous support to the bike patrol. Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for April 2008: Investigations – 89, Adult Arrests Total – 56, Motor Vehicle Summons – 236, Parking – 14, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 10, Juvenile Charges – 4, Curfew Violations – 0, Protective Custody – 3, Incidents at schools – 3, Summons for False Alarms – 0, False Alarm Calls – 28 Warning Letters – 1, Driving While Under the Influence - 10. Chief Tursi also reported the various training that the Officers attended, and the various programs that the officers and the Chief participated in. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Report as follows: Medical Emergencies – 53, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 4, Fire Stand Bys – 3, Non Emergency Transports – 1, Patients transported to the hospital – 42 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 15.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. March reported that the Department has been picking up branches and bagged leaves through out the Town, performed maintenance at Whomsley Field for their opening day, dug out the dirt and grass around all of the playground equipment at the AA field and laid down wood mulch, resumed Friday morning sweeps, started the spring grass cutting, transferred the Township files from the library to the garage, and are currently working on clean the storm drains through out the Township. Mr. March also reported on the work anticipated to be done in May. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mrs. Hatcher thanked Mr. Henry Stellwag for his information that was given at a previous meeting regarding a pothole that needed to be repaired on Washington Street.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco reported that the Committee is continuing to work on the budget.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mr. Carroll thanked Mr. March for the excellent maintenance work that was done at the playing fields and stated that there are stills issues regarding a storage tank and sprinkler heads at Hooker Street. Mayor Conard stated that those issues have been resolved.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Mrs. Hatcher reported that the upcoming Saturday will be the "Town Wide Clean Up Day" and clarified that this is for residents who wish to clean up their properties. Mrs. Hatcher stated that the garage will be opened from 10:00am – 2:00pm and the dumpster will be open for trash. Mr. Prisco questioned what can be placed in the dumpster. Mr. March answered that concrete, oil based paints, tires, construction debris, tree stumps will not be accepted in the dumpster. Mr. Carroll questioned if grass clippings will be accepted. Mr. March answered in the affirmative, that 10% of grass clippings are added to the mulch pile.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro reported that there was a challenge in court regarding the Sex Offender Registration Ordinance, and it has been postponed. The Solicitor is waiting for direction of the Court regarding the Ordinance.

CLERK – COLLECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Dydek reported the Real Estate Collection Status as follows: prior year – 97.17%, current year – 53.60%, next year – 0.00. %, and the second quarter taxes are due on May 1, 2008.

Mrs. Dydek reported the first quarter Vital Statistics Report: Number of people applying for Birth Certificates – 49, Marriage Certificates – 20, Death Certificates – 83, Marriage Licenses Issued – 6, Births of Riverside Residents – 45 and Deaths of Riverside Residents – 22.

Mrs. Dydek reported that 560 dog licenses have been issued, and 57 cat licenses have been issued. Applications for liquor license renewals have been sent out, the School Board Election was held on April 15, 2008 and the Primary Election will be held on June 3, 2008. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack stated that Engineer has begun work on the street evaluations and rankings in the Township, and explained the procedure. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Jack stated that her report has been distributed and noted that she is currently working on the Stormwater Annual Report which is due May 1, 2008; the educational requirements for Stormwater regulations were mailed with the Public Works schedule. Mrs. Jack stated that some residents did not receive the schedules, and they will be mailed again. Mrs. Jack reported on the upcoming grant applications and congratulated the Township Residents on the recycling efforts which was reported in the 2007 Tonnage Grant Report. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mayor Conard inquired if there were any questions or concerns regarding the Planner's Report or the Code Enforcement Officer's Report. There were no questions or concerns presented. Administrator Jack stated that the Planners have submitted their Strategic Plan for the Rehabilitation Area for the Downtown.
