STATEMENT:

Public Notice of this meeting pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act has been given by the Riverside Township Committee in the following manner:

1. Posting written notice on the official bulletin board at the Township Municipal Building on January 4, 2008.
2. Written notice was delivered to the Burlington County Times on January 4, 2008 and mailed to the Courier Post on January 4, 2008.
3. Filed written notice with the Clerk of the Township of Riverside on January 4, 2008.

The regular meeting of the Riverside Township Committee was held on the above date at the Riverside Township Municipal Building.

Roll Call: Mr. Prisco, Mr. Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Conard. Mr. Polino was excused since he is actively serving in Iraq in the war.

The following people were also present: Municipal Clerk Dydek, Administrator Jack and Solicitor Saponaro.

Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Carroll that the minutes of the Work Session Meeting of July 21, 2008 and the Regular Meeting of July 21, 2008 be approved as written carried.

PROCLAMATION:

Mr. Prisco made a motion to approve a proclamation honoring Mary Kate Winkelspecht for being crowned the 2008 Farm Fair Queen, seconded by Mr. Conard carried.

Mayor Conard presented the proclamation to Mary Kate Winkelspecht.

Chairman Conard opened the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

Hearing nothing from the public, **motion made by Mr. Carroll and Mrs. Hatcher to close Public Portion (Agenda Items Only) carried.**

ORDINANCES:

Mr. Carroll questioned what changes were being made to Chapter 243 of the Township Code. Administrator Jack explained that there are multiple changes in the Ordinance, but many of the changes are due the insertion of stop signs. Also, parking on the Avenues during a snow storm was changed, parking of tractor trailers, RVs, trailers etc. was changed from parking between certain hours, to not being able to park on a Township street, parking on dirt has been removed, and the weight specifications were reviewed. Mr. Carroll questioned if the changes were for the Public's safety. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative.

Mrs. Hatcher questioned if the change to make Hancock Street one way was included. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. Chief Tursi stated that West Hancock would be one way with the direction towards Fairview Street.

Mayor Conard questioned if the affected residents have been made aware of the change of direction on Hancock St. Administrator Jack answered that the residents will not be notified until the signs are installed; and the area will be heavily monitored.

Mr. Carroll questioned the cost associated with changing the direction of Hancock St. Administrator Jack answered that it is minimal.

Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher, seconded by Mr. Prisco that Ordinance 2008 - #07 entitled, "AN AMENDING CHAPTER 243 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" " be approved at the first reading. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Nays – None.

Motion carried.

Mr. Prisco questioned if Ordinance 2008 - #08 conforms to the 2008 Municipal Budget. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative.

Motion made by Mr. Prisco, seconded by Mr. Carroll that Ordinance 2008 - #08 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY, FOR THE YEAR 2008." be approved at the first reading. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Ayes – Messrs. Prisco, Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Conard.

Nays – None.

Motion carried.

Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher, seconded by Mr. Carroll that Ordinance 2008 - #09 entitled, “AN ORDINANCE GRANTING RENEWAL OF MUNICIPAL CONSENT TO COMCAST TO CONSTRUCT, CONNECT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN A CABLE TELEVISION AND COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM IN THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE, NEW JERSEY.” be approved at the first reading. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Ayes – Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Carroll, Prisco, and Conard.

Nays – None.

Motion carried.

RESOLUTIONS:

**RESOLUTION 2008-#72 TAX COLLECTOR'S OVERPAYMENT
RESOLUTION.**

Mr. Carroll made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#72, seconded by Mr. Prisco. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs Carroll, Prisco, Mrs. Hatcher, and Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Mr. Carroll questioned if Resolution 2008 - #73 was for Big Daddy's Pub. Municipal Clerk Dydek answered in the affirmative. Mr. Prisco questioned why there was a delay in the initial renewal process. Municipal Clerk Dydek answered that her office was waiting for the Tax Clearance Certificate.

**RESOLUTION 2008-#73 RENEWAL OF LIQUOR LICENSE FOR PERIOD
AUGUST 19, 2008 TO JUNE 30, 2009.**

Mr. Carroll made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#73, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes –Mr. Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher, Mr. Prisco and Mr. Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Mr. Prisco requested a clarification of Resolution 2008-#74. Municipal Clerk Dydek stated that this Resolution will allow the Committee to adopt the 2008 Municipal Budget without reading it line for line.

**RESOLUTION 2008 - #74 A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF
RIVERSIDE PROVIDING THAT THE 2008 MUNICIPAL BUDGET MAY BE
INTRODUCED BY TITLE ONLY.**

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#74, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mr. Prisco, Mrs. Hatcher, Mr. Carroll and Mr. Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Mr. Prisco requested a clarification of Resolution 2008 - #75. Administrator Jack answered that the amendments are required by the State of New Jersey, and gave some examples of the amendments. Mrs. Jack also stated that she was advised by the State of New Jersey that this amendment Resolution was allowed to be passed at this meeting, if it was not, the Budget would not have been able to be adopted until the next meeting. Administrator Jack stated that the Township was just given this information in late afternoon, just hours before the meeting.

RESOLUTION 2008-#75. AMEDMENT OF THE 2008 MUNICIPAL BUDGET.

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#75, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mr. Prisco, Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Carroll and Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Chairman Conard opened the Public Portion for the 2008 Municipal Budget Hearing. **Hearing nothing from the Public, motion made by Mr. Carroll and Mr. Prisco to close the Public Hearing carried.**

Mr. Carroll questioned if the Township was still going to do the 1% tax deferment from the School Tax. Mayor Conard and Administrator Jack answered in the negative stating it was denied by the State of New Jersey.

RESOLUTION 2008-#76 ADOPTION OF THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET.

Mr. Carroll made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#76, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mr. Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Prisco and Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Administrator Jack explained that the residents have moved from the properties stated on the Resolution and there have been requests from other residents to have the signs removed. Mrs. Hatcher questioned if a handicapped sign was placed on Washington St. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative, but it was placed on Morton as requested.

RESOLUTION 2008 - #77 APPROVAL FOR REMOVAL OF HANDICAPPED PARKING.

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008 - #77, seconded by Mr. Carroll. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs. Prisco, Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher, and Mr. Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Administrator Jack explained the Resolution 2008 - #78 is a municipal charge for mowing of a lawn. Mr. Prisco questioned the location of the property and the amount

of the lien. Administrator Jack answered 239 S. Pavilion Avenue, and the amount is \$50.00.

RESOLUTION 2008 - #78 A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE AUTHORIZING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO PLACE A MUNICIPAL LIEN AGAINST BLOCK 1305, LOT 15.

Mrs. Hatcher made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008 - #78, seconded by Mr. Prisco. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Prisco, Carroll and Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Conard questioned if Resolution 2008-#79 was awarded to the lowest bidder. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. Mr. Prisco questioned the amount of stumps and the price of removal. Administrator Jack stated it was approximately \$66.00 per stump.

RESOLUTION 2008-#79 A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE AWARDING THE STUMP REMOVAL CONTRACT.

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008 - #79, seconded by Mr. Carroll. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs. Prisco, Carroll, Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

Mr. Carroll requested a clarification of Resolution 2008 - #80. Municipal Clerk Dydek explained that in the 2007 Municipal Audit, there is a suggestion of items that should be handled differently, and this Corrective Action Plan specifies that and the Township will commence doing what was suggested. Mr. Prisco stated that there are only two items. Municipal Clerk answered in the affirmative.

RESOLUTION 2008 - #80 APPROVAL OF CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN FOR 2007 MUNICIPAL AUDIT.

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008 - #80, seconded by Mr. Carroll. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs. Prisco, Carroll Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Conard. Nays – None. Motion carried.

ACTION:

- 1) Mr. Prisco questioned what buildings Ms. D'Allesandro will be cleaning. Administrator Jack answered the Municipal Building and the Administrative Offices. Mrs. Hatcher questioned who is liable for Ms. D'Allesandro for her travelling between buildings. Administrator Jack answered that the Township is responsible. **Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Carroll made a motion**, to appoint Melissa D'Allesandro as a Part – Time Cleaner with the Township of Riverside for no more than 10 hours a week **carried**.
- 2) Mr. Carroll questioned if the Special Permit was for an outside affair. Municipal Clerk Dydek answered in the affirmative and stated that this is an annual event for the organization and they submit a map which is reviewed by the Chief of Police. Authorization to approve a Special Permit for a Social Affair for Associacao Nossa Senhora De Fatima for their annual social BBQ on September 20, 2008 approved on a **motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Prisco carried**.
- 3) Mr. Prisco questioned if the following appointments will expire on December 31, 2008. Mayor Conard answered in the affirmative. **Mrs. Hatcher made a motion, seconded by Mr. Prisco that Committeemen Marcus Carroll and Gary Hayman be appointed to the River Route Advisory Committee. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Prisco and Conard. Nays – None. Abstain – Mr. Carroll. Motion carried.**
- 4) **Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Carroll** to permit J & J Lawncare to erect a “Grand Opening” banner at 520 N. Pavilion Avenue for a period not to exceed two weeks **carried**. Mayor Conard stated that J&J Lawncare has done a fantastic job with the property. Mr. Prisco questioned their status with the Planning Board. Administrator Jack answered that he has received the approvals from the Planning Board.
- 5) Administrator Jack stated that she is having difficulty locating a person for the inspector services. Mr. Prisco stated that the term should be through September 30, 2008. Mayor Conard stated that he will assist the Administrator with the search. Authorization to enter into a temporary contract with BIU Electrical Sub code and Inspector Services through September 30, 2008 **approved on motion by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Carroll carried**.
- 6) **Mr. Prisco made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher** authorizing to extend the Agreement to provide a School Resource Officer between Riverside Township and the Riverside Board of Education for the 2008-2009 school years **carried**.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for July 2008: Investigations – 119, Adult Arrests Total – 77, Motor Vehicle Summons – 212, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 6, Juvenile Incidents – 5, Juvenile Charges – 5, Juvenile Incidents at school - 0, Curfew Violations – 4, Stationhouse Adjustments – 0, False Alarm Calls – 26, False Alarm Warning Letters - 1, Domestic Violence Cases – 14, DWI Arrests - 10. Chief Tursi also reported the Detective services; various training that the Officers attended; meetings that were attended by the Officers, correspondence received, and grants that are currently being pursued as well as grant programs that have been received. Chief Tursi stated that he has received notice that Patrolwoman Urtasan and her canine has received certification as narcotics officers, and department procedures are being reviewed to accommodate the canine. A copy of the report is on file in the Clerk's Office.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for July 2008: Medical Emergencies – 71, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 6, Fire Stand Bys – 2, Non Emergency Transports – 2, Patients transported to the hospital – 22 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 15.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for August 2008: Medical Emergencies – 66, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 2, Fire Stand Bys – 5, Non Emergency Transports – 0, Patients transported to the hospital – 53 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 15.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. March reported on the following: the Public Works Department will be picking up branches every Monday and Thursday, Friday Morning sweeps will continue through October (weather permitting). All the parks, lots and ball fields had their grass cut, road maintenance was performed, bagged leaf collection has finished however residents may drop off bagged leaves between 8:30am and 4:00pm Monday thru Friday at the garage, a tree near the Municipal Building was cut down with the assistance of Delanco Township (who grinded the stump), a tree was removed on Henry Street, preparations will be done for the car show, and Public Works assisted the Administrative Offices in the move from the Municipal Building to the Administrative Building. The anticipated activities for September were announced. Mrs. Hatcher commended Mr. March for doing his best while being shorthanded with the staff.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco thanked everyone for their work with the budget.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mr. Carroll requested that he be able to investigate if a hardy grass may be planted at Spring Garden Park at no cost to the Township. Mayor Conard stated that there is top soil that may be spread to a one to two inch overlay, but being short handed it never happened. Mayor Conard questioned if any of the Committee has any concerns with the request. No concerns were presented.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Mrs. Hatcher thanked Mr. Carroll, Mr. Prisco, the Portuguese Club, Mrs. Dydek, Ms. Crowe and Mrs. Jack for their assistance with the basketball free throw tournament. Mrs. Hatcher stated that there are donations being sent in to help pay for the basketballs. Mrs. Hatcher also reported on the RBA Car Show from 2:00p.m. – 8:00pm and Community Day, on September 6, 2008. Mr. Prisco questioned if Community Day is being held earlier this year. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative.

Mr. Carroll thanked Mrs. Jack, Mrs. Dydek and Ms. Crowe for their assistance with the Basketball Free Throw Tournament.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro had nothing to report.

CLERK – COLLECTOR’S REPORT:

Mrs. Dydek reported the Real Estate Collection Status for August 2008 as follows: current year – 98.19%, and the prior year - 95.22%.

Mrs. Dydek reported that there have been 684 dog licenses issued and 68 cat licenses. Mrs. Dydek also stated that all persons that have been appointed or elected to their respected boards need to be sworn in. The persons elected to County Committee seats need to be sworn in and receive their certificates if not already done so. The General Election will be held on November 4, 2008.

ENGINEER’S REPORT:

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer’s Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.

ADMINISTRATOR’S REPORT:

Administrator Jack stated that her report has been submitted. Administrator Jack stated that the Administrative Office have relocated to 237 S. Pavilion Ave. Administrator Jack stated that there have been complaints regarding the asphalt at Rancocas Avenue at the 700 block. The contractor will be out to the site to address any issues. Mr. Prisco questioned if everyone received their keys to the new building. Administrator Jack answered in the negative. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.


RESOLUTIONS:
