Roll Call: Messrs. Prisco, Van Meter, Mrs. Hatcher, Mr. Polino and Mr. Conard. The following people were also present: Municipal Clerk Dydek, Administrator Jack and Solicitor Saponaro.

Prisco and Polino carried.**

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Motion made by Mr. Polino and Mrs. Hatcher that the minutes of the Work Session Meeting of May 18, 2009 and the Regular Meeting of May 18, 2009 be approved as written carried.

OPEN PORTION:

Chairman Conard opened the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

Hearing nothing from the public, **motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mrs. Hatcher to close Public Portion (Agenda Items Only) carried.**

Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

PUBLIC HEARING:

Chairman Conard opened the Public Hearing for the 2009 Municipal Budget.

Hearing nothing from the public, motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Polino to close the Public Hearing for the 2009 Municipal Budget carried.

CONSENT AGENDA:

Mr. Prisco requested that Resolution 2009 - #58 be pulled from the consent agenda.

Mr. Polino questioned which liquor license Resolution 2009 - #59 was renewing. Municipal Clerk Dydek answered the Resolution was for River Club Enterprises LLC.

Mr. Prisco questioned Resolution 2009 - #63 regarding the number of handicapped parking signs. Administrator Jack answered that she would like the Resolution to pass and then she and the Road Forman will lay out the spots, have the Chief of Police review them and then come back to the Committee for approval. Mr. Polino questioned if there was more than one handicapped parking request. Administrator Jack stated that she had emailed the request that was received from Father David who requested six additional handicapped spots which would be a total of eight handicapped parking spots in front of Resurrection Parish. The Engineer has also reviewed the request.

Mr. Polino made a motion, seconded by Mr. Prisco that the consent agenda be approved carried.

Mr. Polino made a motion that Resolution 2009 - #58 entitled, "RENEWAL OF LIQUOR LICENSE FOR PERIOD JULY 1, 2009 TO JUNE 30, 2010" be approved seconded by Mrs. Hatcher. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: Ayes – Mr. Polino, Mrs. Hatcher, Messrs. Van Meter and Conard. Nays – None. Abstain – Mr. Prisco. Motion carried.

ACTION:

- 1) **Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Polino made a motion to accept the resignation of Special Officer Michael Filandro carried.** The Township Committee wished Mr. Filandro much success with his new job in Westampton Township.
- 2) Chief Tursi gave a review of the application process for the Special Police Officer. Mrs. Hatcher questioned if there were any other applicants from the area that applied. Mrs. Hatcher stated her concern of Mr. Karaba's residence is a distance away. Chief Tursi stated that this applicant was the most qualified and the appointment will be for a one year term. Chief Tursi also stated that two of the Explorers have expressed interest in becoming Special Officers. Mr. Polino questioned if the Township will have to pay for the Academy Training. Chief Tursi stated that the Township will not have to pay for the Academy Training, just Class II Training which is approximately \$600.00. Chief Tursi stated that the Township will not have to pay their salaries. Mrs. Hatcher questioned if they will have to stay in Riverside for a specific amount of time. Chief Tursi answered two years. There was a brief discussion on allowing the two explorers attending the Police Academy. Mrs. Hatcher question how many part timers are currently working. Chief Tursi answered one person. Authorization to appoint Timothy Karaba as a Special Officer with the Riverside Township Police Department pending a successful background investigation **approved on motion by Mr. Polino and Mrs. Hatcher carried.**
- 3) Authorization to execute contracts with the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs to undertake ADA improvements to Town Hall under the Small Cities Program **approved on motion by Messrs. Prisco and Polino carried.**
- 4) Municipal Clerk Dydek stated that she spoke with the Pastor of the Moravian Church. There will be no alcohol or Legalized Games of Chance, there will only be a moon bounce for the children. Because of the moon bounce, they will need a carnival license. Mrs. Hatcher stated that she spoke with the Pastor also and he graciously thanked the Township for moving the date for the Senior Oktoberfest. Mr. Prisco questioned the construction of a building. Administrator Jack stated that they have not gotten any permits. Municipal Clerk Dydek stated that she believes that the fair will be held in the parking lot and the proceeds will go towards the construction project. **Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Polino authorizing the First Moravian Church to hold an "October Fair" on Saturday October 17, 2009 subject to review and approval by the Chief of Police carried.**

Administrator Jack stated that the State of New Jersey has stated that all Municipalities are now required to have a Qualified Purchasing Agent (QPA). Any time that the Township goes out to quote or bid, the QPA will have to sign off. Administrator Jack stated that she has contacted Mr. Gary LaVenia from Shared Services hoping to go into a Shared Services Agreement with this. Otherwise, Administrator Jack or Municipal Clerk Dydek or Chief Financial Officer Crowe would need to become certified as a QPA which the Township will have to pay for.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for May 2009: Investigations – 102, Adult Arrests Total – 80, Motor Vehicle Summons – 191, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 15, Juvenile Charges – 9, Protective Custody – 3, Curfew Violations – 0, False Alarm Calls – 17, False Alarm Warning Letters - 0, Summons for Violation of False Alarms – 0, Domestic Violence Cases – 21 and Stationhouse Adjustments – 0. Chief Tursi also reported the School Resource Officer's progress and investigations, Detective services; various training that the Officers attended; meetings that were attended by the Officers, correspondence received, and grants that are currently being pursued as well as grant programs that have been received. Also, Lt. Eliason issued commendations to Officer Barnes and Officer Conard for investigating a 911 call for a person that was struck by the Light Rail Line and thrown in the brush. Patrolman Nolan received and exceptional service award for assisting Delran Township with a burglary case. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the report read by Chief Tursi. Mrs. Hatcher questioned the grant that was being applied for that related to Detective Brock regarding the extra police officers. Chief Tursi stated that this grant is still in process. Mr. Prisco questioned how everything is going with the relocation of the court. Chief Tursi stated that everything is going well. No other questions were presented.

Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Polino that the Chief of Police's report be accepted carried.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Report for May 2009: Medical Emergencies – 80, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 5, Fire Stand Bys – 2, Non Emergency

Transports – 0, Patients transported to the hospital – 62 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 23.

Motion made by Mrs. Hatcher and Mr. Polino that the Delran Emergency Squad report be accepted carried.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. Van Meter stated that Mr. March will give his report. Mr. March reported that the Public Works Department is picking up bagged leaves every Wednesday until June 24th, performed road maintenance throughout the Township, the street sweeper has been through the east end section and is currently in the middle section of town, the grass was cut at all the Township owned parks and lots, two handicapped parking signs were installed and preparations were completed for the Memorial Day Parade. Mr. Van Meter reported the activities for July 2009. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

Mr. Polino questioned if there was a problem with parking in St. Peter's Church (Jesus, the Good Shepherd) parking lot on Memorial Day. No one was aware of any problems.

Mr. Van Meter questioned if the Public Works Department have been on Harrison Street where debris was removed near the Teicher Property. Mr. March answered in the negative.

Mr. Polino questioned Chief Tursi if "no parking" signs can be placed on Pavilion Avenue for the parade to be held on July 5th.

Mrs. Hatcher stated that many residents are stating how well the street sweeper is cleaning the streets.

Mr. Polino made a motion, seconded by Mrs. Hatcher to accept the report written by Mr. March carried.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco reported that the adoption of the 2009 Municipal Budget is delayed due to the State of New Jersey has not given approval. A report on the tax appeals has been done by the Solicitor. Mr. Prisco questioned if Municipal Clerk Dydek had anything to report. Municipal Clerk Dydek stated that she attended a seminar and Attorney William Kearns spoke regarding public notices and the statutory requirements. The statute states that the Township must only send notices of Township meetings to the newspapers, not advertise them. By doing this, the Township would save money. The notices would be posted at the Administrative Building and possibly on the website in addition to being sent to the newspapers.

Motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Polino to accept the report given by Mr. Prisco carried.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mr. Polino reported that the Riverside PAL (Riverside Youth Athletic League) requested funding from the Township for their insurance. It was made clear to them that in the future the Township is requiring documentation of audit reports and financial statements. Also, Mr. Polino stated his concerns regarding the Chester Avenue Field for the removal of the poles. Also, an American Flag and lighting should be installed. Mrs. Hatcher stated the Township is trying to get lighting installed. Mr. Polino stated that he has asked Anthony McFadden numerous times for quotes with no response. Mr. Polino stated that he would like to see a light installed for the flagpole for the residents in that area. Administrator Jack stated that she would handle this project. Administrator Jack questioned if a pitching machine being installed at the AA Field. Mr. Polino said that he was not aware of a pitching machine being installed at the AA Field; a pitching machine is being requested for the Bob Kenney Field. Mrs. Hatcher stated that possibly PSE&G could run an electrical line at the AA Field. Mr. Polino thanked Mrs. Hatcher for her assistance.

Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Van Meter to accept the report submitted from Mr. Polino carried.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Mrs. Hatcher reported that the Parade is being held on July 5, 2009 starting on Pavilion Avenue at 12:30 p.m. going to Fairview Street and ending at the VFW Post in Delran. The Basketball Free Throw Tournament will be held in July. Keating and Pulte came in and gave a presentation and an application to start redevelopment behind the Watchcase Building and will return on June 25th.

Motion made by Mr. Polino and Mr. Van Meter to accept the report submitted from Mrs. Hatcher carried.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro reported that he has submitted a written report in case of a last minute emergency. Solicitor Saponaro apologized to Mr. Prisco for the typographical error of the spelling of his name in the report.

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Solicitor's report. No questions were presented. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mr. Van Meter made a motion to accept Solicitor Saponaro's report seconded by Mr. Polino carried.

CLERK – COLLECTOR’S REPORT:

Mrs. Dydek reported the collection for June 2009 as follows: current year – 96.12%, next year – 0%, the prior year – 99.88%. For the first half of 2009 the total taxes billed were \$6,512,915.59. The total amount collected is \$6,260,661.89. As soon as the Budget is approved, the Tax Collector will be processing the tax bills.

Mrs. Dydek also reported that there have been 566 dog licenses issued and 43 cat licenses issued. Mille Abriola the part time police clerk will be canvassing the Township performing the dog census for unlicensed animals.

Mr. Prisco questioned if it is anticipated that the tax bills will be mailed on time. Municipal Clerk Dydek answered in the negative, a Resolution would have to be done extending the payment date and the third quarter taxes would be due 25 days from the date of mailing.

Mrs. Hatcher questioned what happens when the Township receives shade tree letters. Administrator Jack stated that the letters that are received from the residents are forwarded to the Shade Tree Committee. The Shade Tree Committee sends a person out to inspect the tree and a letter is sent to the resident stating whether the tree is healthy or not. The Administrator said that she is receiving feedback from the residents that they are not receiving response letters. The Township may need to adjust the process.

Mr. Prisco questioned if all the trees that were on the previous list were cut down. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. Mayor Conard questioned if all the stumps have been grinded and removed. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. A brief discussion ensued concerning the tree stump removals.

Mr. Prisco and Mrs. Hatcher made a motion to accept the report read by Mrs. Dydek carried.

ENGINEER’S REPORT:

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer’s Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk’s Office.

Mayor Conard stated that when reconstruction work is being done on the streets or other projects, the Committee would like the Engineer to be present at meetings.

Motion made by Mr. Polino and Mr. Van Meter accepting the Engineer’s Report as written carried.

PLANNING REPORT

Mayor Conard questioned why a Planner's Report has not been submitted again. Administrator Jack answered that the only thing that the Planner is working on is the signage ordinance. Mayor Conard stated that the Township has not received a Planner's Report for the last 3-4 meetings. Mr. Prisco questioned which Planner was the discussion about. Administrator Jack answered the Special Projects Planner and that the only project that the Township has now is the Downtown Development Plan which includes a sign development ordinance which is currently being reviewed by the Administrator and three members of the Redevelopment Advisory Committee. The Planner is waiting for feedback from the ordinance review. Mr. Polino stated that we should have a report next month from the Planner. Mayor Conard stated that the Planner need to communicate more information with the Township Committee. Administrator Jack stated that she asked the Planner to draft the ordinance with an explanatory cover letter so that the Committee may review it.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack stated that her report has been submitted. Administrator Jack reported that street sweeping commenced April 3, 2009 with the Friday morning sweeps and April 6, 2009 with the residential sweeps that are Monday through Thursday. The Stormwater pamphlets have been mailed to the property owners the week of March 16, 2009 and the annual report was submitted by the May 2, 2009 deadline. The stormdrains are being monitored by the Public Works Department. The Public Works Schedules have been mailed to property owners with the stormwater pamphlet. Two New Jersey DOT Local Aid Applications were submitted on June 10, 2009. One is for the reconstruction of Kossuth, Filmore and Taylor Streets Phase IV and the other one is for the reconstruction of Lee, Carroll, Grant and Park Phase II. The Town Hall Renovations Project began on May 20, 2009 and is proceeding on schedule. The Township Committee stated that they would like to view the renovations that have been completed so far. The Court Offices began operating from 237 S. Pavilion Avenue from May 20, 2009 and will continue to June 19, 2009. The Court Trials have been moved to Edgewater Park and everything is running smoothly. The Phase II Filmore, Taylor and Kossuth Sts. have been completed. Phase III bids were received on June 11, 2009 and the Engineer is preparing a tabulation and will make a recommendation on the award. The County has completed the installation of the curb cuts along Bridgeboro and Fairview Streets and the audit for the 2008 Township properties has been prepared and distributed to the Fund Commissioners for review by the Burlington County Joint Insurance Fund. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mr. Van Meter questioned the property located at 803 Bridgeboro Street. Administrator Jack informed the Committee that when this house was built, the sewerage connection was done improperly which created a huge sink hole on Bridgeboro Street. Bridgeboro Street is a County Road, so the County has been notified. The Township has been told that the County will handle the situation.

Mr. Polino and Mrs. Hatcher made a motion to accept the Administrator's report as read carried.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Code Enforcement Officer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Van Meter to accept the Code Enforcement Officer's Report as written carried.

Administrator Jack stated that court dates have been scheduled for June 24th 2009 for the property maintenance summons that were issued.

Hearing nothing further from the Public, motion made by Mr. Polino and Mr. Prisco carried: Public Portion be closed.


RESOLUTION:
