The regular meeting of the Riverside Township Committee was held on the above date at the Riverside Township Municipal Building.

Roll Call: Mr. Prisco, Mr. Carroll, and Mr. Conard. Mrs. Hatcher was excused and Mr. Polino was excused since he is actively serving in Iraq in the war.

The following people were also present: Municipal Clerk Dydek, Administrator Jack and Solicitor Saponaro.

PROCLAMATION:

Mr. Carroll made a motion to table the proclamations for Abigail Stottlemire and Daisy Berry, seconded by Mr. Prisco carried. (The proclamations were tabled because none of the recipients were present at the meeting).

Motion made by Mr. Prisco and Mr. Carroll that the minutes of the Work Session Meeting of August 18, 2008, the Regular Meeting of August 18, 2008 and the Closed Session Meeting of August 18, 2008 be approved as written carried.

Chairman Conard opened the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

Hearing nothing from the public, **motion made by Mr. Carroll and Mr. Prisco to close Public Portion (Agenda Items Only) carried.**

Motion made by Mr. Carroll, seconded by Mr. Prisco that Ordinance 2008 - #10 entitled, “BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS GENERAL IMPROVEMENTS, APPROPRIATING \$285,410 THEREFORE AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$126,139 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING THE COSTS FOR SAID IMPROVMENTS AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY” be *tabled* at the first reading. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows:

Mr. Prisco made a motion to adopt the Proclamation honoring Daisy Berry upon her ninetieth birthday, seconded by Mr. Carroll carried.

Ms. Berry was not present at the meeting.

Mr. Prisco made a motion, seconded by Mr. Carroll that the consent agenda be approved carried.

RESOLUTIONS:

Administrator Jack stated that under the recommendation of the Solicitor, she would like to add the following into the Resolution, "hearing officer and /or independent counsel". Mr. Carroll questioned if this Resolution was for the Pavilion Inn. Administrator Jack answered in the affirmative. Mr. Carroll questioned if they received their money to convert the establishment into a restaurant. Administrator Jack answered in the negative, the bank is still processing their application. However with the condition of the economy, the loan process is very stringent. Mr. Carroll questioned what the overall achievement that is expected from the hearing. Administrator Jack stated that the hearing is regarding disciplinary actions brought against the establishment. Mayor Conard stated that this establishment has cost the taxpayers much wasted money and time as well as loss of time for the police department. Mayor Conard stated that the police cannot sit down there for six hours at a time because of the problems at the establishment. Mr. Carroll questioned if the Resolution could be tabled. Administrator Jack stated because of proper procedures, it should be brought to the table for introduction. Mayor Conard stated that this has been discussed previously in the work sessions. Administrator Jack stated that if the Resolution does not pass, the Township would not be able to hire independent counsel to oversee the hearings. Solicitor Saponaro stated that the Township Committee has the ability to be the hearing officer, but from past discussions, the Committee suggested to hire an independent counsel. Mr. Carroll stated that he

doesn't understand why this process is being done. Solicitor Saponaro explained that if the Township is not going to prosecute the violations, then essentially, the liquor license establishment will not have any penalty repercussions from the numerous violations that they have had. Solicitor further explained that the Chief of Police had brought forth many violations against Sylbert Corporation.

Mr. Conard made a motion to adopt Resolution 2008-#94, seconded by Mr. Carroll. Upon roll call, the vote was as follows: Ayes – Messrs Conard, and Carroll. Nays – None. Abstain – Mr. Prisco. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY:

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for August 2008: Investigations – 124, Adult Arrests Total – 124, Motor Vehicle Summons – 258, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 7, Parking Summons – 24, Juvenile Incidents – 14, Juvenile Charges – 8, Protective Custody – 1, Juvenile Incidents at school - 0, Curfew Violations – 4, Stationhouse Adjustments – 1, False Alarm Calls – 16, False Alarm Warning Letters - 1, Domestic Violence Cases – 20, DWI Arrests – 7. Chief Tursi also reported the Detective services; various training that the Officers attended; meetings that were attended by the Officers, correspondence received, and grants that are currently being pursued as well as grant programs that have been received. A copy of the report is on file in the Clerk's Office.

Mayor Conard questioned if the Delran Emergency Squad submitted their monthly report. Administrator Jack answered in the negative.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. March reported that the Public Works Department is currently cutting grass at all parks, lots and ball fields. Friday morning sweeps will continue every Friday through October with weather permitting. Road maintenance was completed throughout the town, all preparations for the car show were completed, the cross walks and curbs were painted around the school, and leaf compost has been hauled out to make room for the fall leaf collection. Mr. March stated that there is still free mulch that may be picked up by the residents if needed. The anticipated activities for October were announced. Mr. Carroll questioned Mr. March how many employees in the department are currently not able to work. Mr. March answered two are not working, which leaves two men available to work. Mr. Carroll stated that the Public Works Department should be commended for performing their duties although half of the staff is currently unavailable to work.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco had nothing to report.

DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:

Mr. Carroll stated that he is still working on revitalizing the grass at the Spring Garden Park.

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:

Administrator Jack stated there are two upcoming events, the scarecrow in the park which will also have some community day events since community day was cancelled, this will start at 9:00am on October 4, 2008 and the senior Oktoberfest which will be held on October 18, 2008 from 1:00pm – 4:00pm. Also, the preparations for Christmas in Riverside will begin in October.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro stated the process for obtaining a hearing officer for a public hearing involving a liquor license if needed.

CLERK – COLLECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Dydek reported the Real Estate Collection Status for September 2008 as follows: current year – 46.38%, and the prior year - 98.32%. The tax rate was received on September 9, 2008; the bills were printed and will be mailed by the end of the week.

Mrs. Dydek reported that there have been 694 dog licenses issued and 68 cat licenses.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack stated that her report has been submitted. Administrator Jack stated that she is proceeding with the renovations of the Municipal Building and stated the process. Also, Administrator Jack continues to work on revising the Ordinances. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Code Enforcement Officer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

Mayor Conard questioned the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Planner's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.
