**STATEMENT:**

**Public Notice** of this meeting pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act has been given by the Riverside Township Committee in the following manner:

1. Posting written notice on the official bulletin board at the Riverside Township Administrative Office Building on January 5, 2011.
2. Written notice was delivered to the Burlington County Times on January 5, 2011 and the Courier Post on January 5, 2011.
3. Filed written notice with the Clerk of the Township of Riverside on January 5, 2011.

The regular meeting of the Riverside Township Committee was held on the above date at the Riverside Township Municipal Building with the following members present: Messrs. Prisco, Van Meter, and Conard together with Township Administrator Meghan Jack, Municipal Clerk Susan M. Dydek, and Solicitor Saponaro. Mr. Polino and Mrs. Hatcher were absent.

**Motion made by Mr. Prisco, seconded by Mr. Conard to excuse Mr. Polino's absence (Mr. Polino is currently serving his Country in the military) and Mrs. Hatcher's absence carried.**

**Motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Prisco that the following minutes be approved as written: the Work Session Meeting of July 25, 2011 and the Regular Meeting of July 25, 2011 carried.**

Chairman Conard opened the meeting to the public for agenda items only.

Hearing nothing from the public, **motion made by Mr. Van Meter and Mr. Prisco to close Public Portion (Agenda Items Only) carried.**

Mr. Prisco questioned if taxi cabs are currently allowed in Riverside Township. Administrator Jack stated that although there are no operating taxi cabs in Riverside Township; taxi cabs are currently allowed in Riverside Township. However, the current Code is currently significantly out of date.







## RESOLUTION 2011-83

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING INCREASE OF THE  
TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE'S BID THRESHOLD TO  
\$36,000.00 AND QUOTE THRESHOLD TO 15%  
OF THE BID THRESHOLD**

Whereas, on January 1, 2010, Governor Christie signed into law the Bill known as P.L. 2009, c.166 to the Local Public Contracts Law; and

Whereas, said amendments to the Local Public Contracts Law became effective on January 1, 2011; and

Whereas, under the newly enacted provisions of the law, a public entity's bid threshold may be increased to \$36,000.00 if a Qualified Purchasing Agent (QPA) has been identified and when so authorized by resolution of the governing body of the contracting unit so as to allow purchases up to that increased bid threshold without public advertising for bids; and

Whereas, said amendments also permit the governing body to establish the public entity's quote threshold at 15% of the public entity's bid threshold; and

Whereas, the Township Committee has entered into a shared services agreement to identify a QPA and the Administrator has recommended adoption of this resolution increasing the Township of Riverside's bid threshold to \$36,000.00 and increasing the quote threshold to 15% of the bid threshold.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved by the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside as follows:


1. That effective January 1, 2011, the Township of Riverside's bid threshold level be and is hereby increased to \$36,000.00 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3 as amended, for any project after January 1, 2011.
2. That effective January 1, 2011, the Township of Riverside's quote threshold is hereby authorized and established to be 15% of the Township's bid threshold in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law as amended, and the appropriate Township Officials are hereby authorized to award contracts not exceeding said quote threshold without seeking quotes.

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside has requested quotes for the installation of an ADA lift at the Municipal Building; and





**RESOLUTION 2011-#85**  
**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE OPPOSING S-2950 AND A-4128, WHICH WOULD ALLOW FOR MODIFICATION TO LAND USE APPROVALS BECAUSE OF CHANGED ECONOMICS**

**WHEREAS**, S-2950 and A-4128 provide a two-year window in which any development approval granted before 2006 or now in foreclosure or subject to a deed in lieu can apply for, and receive approval for, a use which is not permitted by ordinance, without the need for a use variance or otherwise complying with the zoning ordinance of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, a fundamental premise of land use law and sound planning is that land use decisions, including approvals of development applications and zoning, are made on the basis of the characteristics of the land, its environment, any unique characteristics, and what is in the best interest of the public, and not based on who happens to own the land; and

**WHEREAS**, S-2950 and A-4128 also establishes an expedited approval process, requiring the land use board to determine completeness of the application within 30 days, and then 60 days from the determination of completeness to rule on the application; and

**WHEREAS**, this time frame is insufficient considering what may be proposed, and it is inequitable to require an expedited process for a proposed "adaptive application" while other pending applications are accorded lower priority; and

**WHEREAS**, S-2950 and A-4128 put no standards in place for the local land use board to apply, other than proof that the approval is no longer economically viable, which is inadequately defined; and

**WHEREAS**, the lack of standards would expose any approval or denial by the municipality to possible legal challenge;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside that enactment of S-2950 and A-4128 would usurp, undermine, and overturn local zoning by effectively rescinding all applicable zoning of the property, and provide no adequate public safeguards; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the Governing Body of the Township of Riverside strongly opposes S-2950 and A-4128; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to the Governor of the State of New Jersey, Senator Diane Allen, Congressman John Runyan, Assemblymen Jack Connors and Herb Conway, members of the Senate Community and Urban Affairs Committee, the members of the Assembly Housing and Local Government Committee, Senator Steven Oroho, Assemblyman Albert Coutinho and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

**RESOLUTION 2011 - #86**  
**A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE 2011 FEE SCHEDULE.**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 150 currently provides for provisions allowing for the levying of annual fees; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Committee wishes to amend this provision to allow for an increase in certain annual fees;

**NOW, WHEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED** by the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside, County of Burlington, State of New Jersey that Chapter 150 is hereby amended as follows:

150-228. Streets and Sidewalks.

E. Moratorium. There shall be a fee of \$2,000.00 charged, in addition to any and all fees above, to open a road that has been reconstructed or repaved by the Township of Riverside, or its designated agents, within the previous five (5) years.

150-236. Taxicabs.

Each application shall be accompanied by a license fee of \$100 for a single taxicab to be licensed, together with a license fee of \$100 for each additional cab. There shall be submitted with each application a schedule of the rates, fees or charges proposed to be made for the use within the Township of Riverside of such taxicabs sought to be licensed. A fee of \$25.00 will be charged to transfer any license, for identification badge, for any lost license and for a temporary permit.

Chief Tursi reported the Police Activity for July 2011: Investigations – 129, Adult Arrests Total – 70, Motor Vehicle Summons – 112, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 6, Juvenile Charges – 8, Curfew Violations – 4, Protective Custody – 4, Domestic Violence Cases – 12, Summons for False Alarms – 1, False Alarm Calls - 27. Chief Tursi also reported the various training that the Officers attended, the various programs that the officers and the Chief participated in, and various awards and commendations that the police officers received. A copy of the report is on file in the Office of the Municipal Clerk.

Mayor Conard reported the Delran Emergency Squad Activity for July 2011: Medical Emergencies – 70, Motor Vehicle Accidents – 0, Fire Stand Bys – 5, Non Emergency Transports – 2, Patients transported to the hospital – 54 and Patients refused treatment and transportation – 16.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:**

Mr. Van Meter stated that Mr. March will give the report. Mr. March reported that the Public Works Department has been doing road maintenance throughout the Township, continued chipping branches every Monday and Friday, and continued grass collection on Wednesdays. Friday morning sweeps are continuing, the Department cut grass all at Township parks, lots and ball fields and has performed additional maintenance on Harrison Street. The Department has reconstructed the inlet at Litle and Lichenthal Streets with the help of Willingboro Township. Preparations have begun for the Car Show. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office.

**DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:**

Mr. Prisco reported that the 2011 – 2012 tax bills were mailed today. The third quarter property tax payment has been extended to September 9, 2011. If the third quarter tax is paid on September 10, 2011 interest will accrue from August 1, 2011.

**DEPARTMENT OF RECREATION:**

No report given.

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC EVENTS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:**

No report given.

**SOLICITOR'S REPORT:**

Solicitor Saponaro had nothing to report.

**CLERK – COLLECTOR'S REPORT:**

Municipal Clerk/Deputy Tax Collector Dydek reported that the Real Estate Tax Collection Status as follows: Prior Year – 99.96%, Current Year – 47.87% and Next Year – 0%.

Municipal Clerk Dydek reported that she submitted a written report to the Committee. Mrs. Dydek reported that 680 dog licenses have been issued and 54 cat licenses have been issued. Michele Roy and Mike Wasco were hired as Animal Census Control Officers. They have completed the census and did an excellent job. A report of non-renewals was sent to the Animal Control Officer on July 1, 2011 so that summons may be issued.

**ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

Mayor Conard asked the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

**ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:**

Administrator Jack reported that the FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Application was submitted on January 11, 2011 by the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management on behalf of Riverside Township for improvements to Monroe Street. The Public Notice was published on August 9, 2011 stating FEMA's intent to fund the project. Phase V of Filmore, Taylor and Kossuth Street and Weeks and Howard Street are scheduled to begin on or about August 15, 2011

Mr. Conard questioned the Administrator concerning the status of the manholes and the risers. Administrator Jack stated that Engineer has stated that the manhole covers should be replaced. The Riverside Water Reclamation Authority has provided one for Weeks Avenue, and the remaining manhole covers have been ordered. The contractor has agreed to replace them along with the risers as long as the materials are supplied.

**RENTAL INSPECTOR'S REPORT:**

The Rental Inspector's report has been distributed. Mayor Conard questioned if the Committee had any inquiries. No inquiries were presented. The report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's Office


Check number 14027 is void.
