

ORDINANCE 2011 - #01

**AN ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF RIVERSIDE
TO DELEGATE THE AUTHORITY FOR GRANTING RAFFLE AND BINGO LICENSES**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Riverside, County of Burlington, and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. The Code of the Township of Riverside is hereby supplemented by the addition of the following:

Chapter 117, Bingo and Raffle.

117-2. Bingo and Raffle Licensing.

The Township Clerk is hereby authorized to approve the granting of raffle and bingo licenses to be held in the Township of Riverside.

Section 2. Repealer.

All Ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with the Ordinance are hereby repealed as to said inconsistencies and conflicts.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, part of any section, or clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Township Committee of the Township of Riverside declares that it would have passed the Ordinance and each section and subsection thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication according to law.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND FINANCE:

Mr. Prisco reported that the first quarter property taxes are now delinquent and delinquent notices were sent out on Friday February 18st 2011. Tax sale will be held on April 7, 2011 at 10:00am in the Administrative Office Building. The second quarter 2011 property tax will be due on May 1, 2011 and will be considered delinquent as of May 11, 2011.

Mrs. Hatcher had no reported on the St. Patrick's Day Parade which will be held on Saturday March 12, 2011 at 2:00p.m. Mrs. Hatcher also reported that tonight is the CERT Graduation and stated that Erica Stypinski, Erica Jones, Brandon Canty and Christina Martinez will be graduating.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Solicitor Saponaro reported that he has been working on multiple projects for the Township and asked if there were any questions. No questions were presented.

CLERK – COLLECTOR'S REPORT:

Municipal Clerk/Deputy Tax Collector Dydek reported that the Real Estate Tax Collection Status as follows: Prior Year – 98.00%, Current Year – 46.00% and Next Year – 0%.

Municipal Clerk Dydek reported that Dog and Cat Licenses should be obtained by January 31, 2011 in order to avoid paying the \$15.00 late fine. Rabies certificates must be good through November 1, 2011 in order to obtain a license for 2011. There have been 506 Dog Licenses issued and 53 Cat Licenses. Municipal Clerk Dydek reported that she sent out 67 late notices for residents that did not renew their 2010 and 2011 licenses and approximately 200 late notices for the current renewals.

The School Election will be held on Wednesday April 27, 2011; this date had been pushed back because of the Passover Holiday.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Mayor Conard asked the Committee if there were any questions regarding the Engineer's Report that was submitted. No questions were presented. A copy of the report is on file in the Municipal Clerk's office.

Administrator Jack stated that the Engineer will be present at the next meeting, as it is the end of the first quarter of the year.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Jack reported that the Town Hall renovations project is complete and the close out was done on February 18, 2011. The Capital Budget and the Bond Ordinance that was voted on at tonight's meeting is for the Phase V improvements to Filmore, Taylor and Kossuth Streets. The annual Stormwater Brochures were mailed on February 11, 2011. Administrator Jack also reported that the Township has achieved a "Gold" status with the Joint Insurance Fund at their annual safety breakfast that was held on February 17, 2011.


PUBLIC PORTION:
